



Council Members,

It is my understanding that there is a need for a Coordinator to manage and facilitate Geographic Information System (GIS) efforts within the County. I would like to offer my previous experience as a Geographic Specialist as the answer to this need, as I was previously employed to support geographic operations for the United States Census Bureau. During this time, I constructed and maintained various features and attributes within geodatabases, performed queries and analysis of data, created custom maps with complex variables, and regularly communicated with County and City governments on geographic projects.

My goal is to expand the capacity of the Surveyor's Office to better support the efforts of all County offices. As such, I purpose we revise the current duties of the First Deputy Surveyor to incorporate coordination of geographic efforts. This expansion of responsibilities would involve an additional \$30,000 added onto the current annual salary of the First Deputy. This new total salary, of \$75,000, is based on research into Indiana Counties with similar populations and budgets to Clark with GIS employees. Since this position includes both the duties of the First Deputy and a GIS Coordinator, it offers a savings opportunity to the County. These funds would be paid for out of the 1202 Surveyor's Perpetuation Fund, a fee-based, restricted, non-reverting fund that accumulates around \$120,000 a year.

Your consideration on this potential re-envisioning of the Surveyor's Office scope and responsibilities is appreciated.

This **SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT** (the "Agreement") is made and entered into as of this ^{12th} day of September, 2024, by and between **CATALYST RESCUE MISSION, INC.** (hereinafter called the "Subrecipient") and **CLARK COUNTY, INDIANA** (hereinafter called the "County").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County has received funding from the National Opioid Settlement (the "Opioid Settlement Fund") through the Indiana General Assembly House Enrolled Act 1193 (the "Act") together with related guidance and regulations from the National Opioid Settlement Agreement and from the Indiana State Board of Accounts; and

WHEREAS, the County is desirous of aiding the Subrecipient for the purpose of expanding its Recovery Complex for the provision of drug and alcohol recovery services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Subrecipient and the County for the considerations stated herein, mutually agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF WORK. The Subrecipient shall use the pledged opioid restricted settlement funds from the County for the expansion of its Recovery Complex for the provision of drug and alcohol recovery services (the "Services").

ARTICLE 2. GRANT FUNDING. The Subrecipient shall receive \$253,132.00 in grant funding from the County (the "Grant") to perform the Services.

ARTICLE 3. ELIGIBLE USES. The Subrecipient acknowledges that it is receiving the Grant as a subrecipient under the Act and agrees to limit the use of such funds to the permitted purposes (a "Permitted Purpose") as set forth in the attached **Exhibit E** (list of Opioid Remediation Uses),

ARTICLE 4. PROHIBITED PURPOSES. The Subrecipient agrees that it will not use the Grant for the following prohibited purposes:

- (a) for any prohibited purposes as set forth in the Act or any purposes in contradiction to the list of permitted purposes as set forth in the attached **Exhibit E**; and
- (a) for any additional prohibited purposes under federal, state or local law, regulations, or subsequent amendments to the Act.

ARTICLE 5. ACCESS TO RECORDS; REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. The Subrecipient agrees to keep financial records and supporting documents, including, without

and (ii) certificate of good standing are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

- (c) Subrecipient has the right, power, and authority to enter into this Agreement, grant the rights and benefits herein described, and satisfy its obligations hereunder.

A. TREAT OPIOID USE DISORDER (OUD)

Support treatment of Opioid Use Disorder (“*OUD*”) and any co-occurring Substance Use Disorder or Mental Health (“*SUD/MH*”) conditions through evidence-based or evidence-informed programs or strategies that may include, but are not limited to, those that:²

1. Expand availability of treatment for OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions, including all forms of Medication-Assisted Treatment (“*MAT*”) approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.
2. Support and reimburse evidence-based services that adhere to the American Society of Addiction Medicine (“*ASAM*”) continuum of care for OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions.
3. Expand telehealth to increase access to treatment for OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions, including *MAT*, as well as counseling, psychiatric support, and other treatment and recovery support services.
4. Improve oversight of Opioid Treatment Programs (“*OTPs*”) to assure evidence-based or evidence-informed practices such as adequate methadone dosing and low threshold approaches to treatment.
5. Support mobile intervention, treatment, and recovery services, offered by qualified professionals and service providers, such as peer recovery coaches, for persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions and for persons who have experienced an opioid overdose.
6. Provide treatment of trauma for individuals with OUD (*e.g.*, violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, or adverse childhood experiences) and family members (*e.g.*, surviving family members after an overdose or overdose fatality), and training of health care personnel to identify and address such trauma.
7. Support evidence-based withdrawal management services for people with OUD and any co-occurring mental health conditions.

² As used in this Schedule B, words like “expand,” “fund,” “provide” or the like shall not indicate a preference for new or existing programs.

4. Provide access to housing for people with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions, including supportive housing, recovery housing, housing assistance programs, training for housing providers, or recovery housing programs that allow or integrate FDA-approved medication with other support services.
5. Provide community support services, including social and legal services, to assist in deinstitutionalizing persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions.
6. Support or expand peer-recovery centers, which may include support groups, social events, computer access, or other services for persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions.
7. Provide or support transportation to treatment or recovery programs or services for persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions.
8. Provide employment training or educational services for persons in treatment for or recovery from OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions.
9. Identify successful recovery programs such as physician, pilot, and college recovery programs, and provide support and technical assistance to increase the number and capacity of high-quality programs to help those in recovery.
10. Engage non-profits, faith-based communities, and community coalitions to support people in treatment and recovery and to support family members in their efforts to support the person with OUD in the family.
11. Provide training and development of procedures for government staff to appropriately interact and provide social and other services to individuals with or in recovery from OUD, including reducing stigma.
12. Support stigma reduction efforts regarding treatment and support for persons with OUD, including reducing the stigma on effective treatment.
13. Create or support culturally appropriate services and programs for persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions, including new Americans.
14. Create and/or support recovery high schools.
15. Hire or train behavioral health workers to provide or expand any of the services or supports listed above.

**C. CONNECT PEOPLE WHO NEED HELP TO THE HELP THEY NEED
(CONNECTIONS TO CARE)**

Provide connections to care for people who have—or are at risk of developing—OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions through evidence-based or evidence-informed programs or strategies that may include, but are not limited to, those that:

The Clark County Drainage Board proposes that, upon all necessary approvals being obtained, the Clark County Drainage Board would transfer the sum of \$12,000.00 from its **2700-026 non-reverting account** to an account determined by the Commissioners to compensate the Clark County Engineer for services provided to the Clark County Drainage Board.

Since 2013, Mr. Brian Dixon, the Clark County Engineer, has completed all tasks requested of him by the Drainage Board. The Drainage Board does not have staff with the technical ability to complete the requested tasks.

These tasks include:

1. Technical review of submitted drainage plans for residential subdivisions and commercial developments in the unincorporated areas of Clark County and make recommendations or findings to the Drainage Board regarding the submitted drainage plans to assure compliance with the Clark County Ordinance related to such plans.
2. Site review of drainage issues presented to the Drainage Board by residents in Clark County and report to the Drainage Board.
3. Review and inspection of potential blockage of natural surface water courses base upon petitions presented to the Drainage Board.
4. Inspection of ongoing construction sites for compliance with submitted plans and permits.

Attached is Mr. Dixon's 2023 report which documents the services provide to the Drainage Board and on behalf of Clark County's MS 4 program.

Mr. Dixon has previously not been compensated by the Drainage Board for performing these tasks.



Presently there are 23 active construction sites in Clark County. 82+ inspection reports have been completed on these sites. Inspection for these and all other construction sites will continue throughout the duration of the construction process.

Education and training for Brian Dixon was completed for the following:

1. Road School 3 hours credit

Justification for additional compensation for Drainage Board work

In 2013, newly elected Commissioners Jack Coffman and Rick Stevenson asked me if I was interested in becoming the County Engineer. They also asked if I would continue reviewing new Drainage Plans submitted to the Clark County Drainage Board and completing construction site inspections. However, they mentioned they did not have funds for the drainage review and inspection work.

The County Engineer is responsible for maintenance of all roads and bridges in the County. The Engineer's responsibility does not include drainage plan review and inspection of construction sites. Prior to me accepting the County Engineer's position, the Drainage Board compensated a consultant to do these tasks.

I agreed to accept the position of County Engineer and to complete the items necessary to maintain the roads and bridges throughout Clark County. I also accepted the responsibility to continue reviewing any new drainage plans submitted for new development and to complete construction site inspections to ensure sites are meeting the State/County requirements for Erosion and Sediment control and Drainage requirements.

Since 2013 I have reviewed over 80 new site developments including several subdivisions and commercial developments. Each of these developments must pay a "Drainage Review Fee" to the Clark County Drainage Board. These review fees which range from \$800-\$3500 per site, are deposited in a Drainage Board non-reverting account 0026-2700. To date there is \$121,755 in the Drainage Board non-reverting account.

If the County and or the Drainage Board would choose to use an outside consultant to complete Drainage Reviews and site inspections, funding to compensate the individual or consultant would have to be provided. Presently, most of the area communities are using consultants to complete drainage reviews. Most of the communities use their own MS4 coordinators to complete site inspections. Clark County presently does not have a designated MS4 Coordinator. Again, the Commissioners have asked that I complete all drainage site inspections. No additional funding is provided for this work.

As a representative of the Drainage Board, Jack Coffman and the other members of the Drainage Board are requesting compensation for the review of new developments and inspection of currently active construction sites. This compensation would be provided to the County Engineer who has been completing these tasks for the past 12+ years. The compensation, \$12,000/year plus FICA and PERF would be taken from the Drainage Board account 0026-2700 and would not be a part of the general fund. We request your approval for this request.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR THE JOINT PURCHASE OF AERIAL
PHOTOGRAPHY SERVICES FOR GIS MAPPING PURPOSES**

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the Board of Commissioners of Clark County, Indiana; The City of Jeffersonville, Indiana; The Town of Clarksville, Indiana; The Town of Sellersburg, Indiana; The Clark County Plan Commission; The Clark County Auditor; The Clark County Assessor; and Clark County 911.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Ind. Code 36-1-7 *et seq.* allows political subdivisions in the state of Indiana to enter into Interlocal Agreements; and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire and intent of the Parties to this Agreement to jointly share in the cost of purchasing aerial orthophotography and oblique imagery to be used for GIS (Geographic Information System) mapping purposes, which said GIS mapping is shared with and used by the Parties to this Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with Ind. Code 36-1-7-12, whenever a contract provides for the purchase, sale, or exchange of services, supplies or equipment between or among Indiana governmental entities only, no notice by publication or posting is required; and,

WHEREAS, whenever a contract provides for one Indiana governmental entity to make a purchase for another, compliance by the one with the applicable statutes governing public bids constitutes compliance by the other; and,

WHEREAS, a governmental entity may make a purchase from any other governmental entity or under another governmental entity's referenced written contract if there is compliance with state purchasing law by the original purchasing unit; and,

WHEREAS, by entering into this Agreement, the Parties affirm that they are in compliance with all applicable public purchase requirements and that they have the legal authority to enter into this Agreement; and,

IT IS, THEREFORE, AGREED by the Parties as follows:

1. **DURATION:** This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect from the time it is executed by all Parties until December 31, 2024, unless terminated earlier by written agreement of all Parties.
2. **PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT:** The purpose of this Agreement is to jointly share in the cost of purchasing aerial orthophotography and oblique imagery from Eagleview, which said photography and imagery shall be used for GIS (Geographic Information System) mapping purposes, which said GIS mapping is shared with and used by the Parties to this Agreement.

3. MANNER OF FINANCING, STAFFING AND SUPPLYING THE JOINT UNDERTAKING AND OF ESTABLISHING AND MAINTAINING A BUDGET THEREOF:

a. Manner of Financing:

Eagleview will begin the aerial photography and imagery in 2020 and will complete those services in 2021. The cost for the photography and imagery to be purchased from Eagleview is \$171,306.00, which said cost shall be paid in two equal installments of \$85,653.00 per installment, with the first installment to be paid in 2020 and the second installment to be paid in 2021.

Each installment of \$85,653.00 shall be jointly paid as follows:

If any of the listed entities is unable to pay its full share as listed above, the other entities shall make up the difference of the cost owed in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 per listed entity, except that the not to exceed amount for The Town of Sellersburg is \$5,000.00.

The amounts set forth above shall be placed in the budgets of the various entities and offices for approval by their fiscal bodies during the appropriate budget year. All funding commitments shall be subject to the approval of the various fiscal bodies for each entity and office. No work will be authorized or started until the budgets are certified by the Indiana Department of Local Governmental Finance.

Eagleview has provided contractual optional photography and imagery services for 2022 and 2024 with the same price, terms and conditions as the services that will be provided for 2020 and 2021. If the optional services are selected for 2022 and 2024, then the Parties agree to fund the total cost for those services in the same amounts and same manner set forth above, unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing.

b. Staffing and Supplying Joint Undertaking:

The Clark County Board of Commissioners, in conjunction with the Clark County GIS Committee, will supply any needed staff to administer this Agreement.


c. Maintenance of Budget:

The Clark County Auditor, as the fiscal officer for Clark County, shall maintain all budget and financial records related to the purchase of the said photography and imagery services from Eagleview.

4. **METHODS THAT MAY BE EMPLOYED IN ACCOMPLISHING THE PARTIAL OR COMPLETE TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT:** This Agreement shall terminate upon the fulfillment of all terms and conditions outlined herein, or shall terminate no later than December 31, 2024, unless otherwise terminated by written Agreement of all Parties.
5. **ADMINISTRATION:** This Agreement shall be administered by the Clark County Board of Commissioners, in conjunction with the Clark County GIS Committee. The Commissioners and the Committee shall be authorized to perform all duties and carry out all functions as are necessary to effectuate the purpose of this Agreement.
6. **PAYMENT SCHEDULE:** Each Party shall pay their respective share of the total cost for the said services directly to Eagleview per the due date and per the terms of the payment invoice that will be submitted from Eagleview.
7. **APPROVALS:** This Agreement becomes in full force and effect upon approval by all Parties as indicated by their signatures on this Agreement.
8. **EXTENSION:** This Agreement shall not be extended without written approval of the Parties.
9. **UPON APPROVAL OF THIS AGREEMENT,** the Parties authorize their respective representatives to execute all documents necessary to implement this Agreement.

**FOURTH AMENDMENT
TO
CLARK COUNTY POLICE RETIREMENT PLAN**

WHEREAS, Clark County Police Retirement Plan (hereinafter referred to as "Plan") was established by Clark County Sheriff's Department, Jeffersonville, Indiana (hereinafter referred to as "Employer"), effective as of January 1, 1980; as amended by a complete restatement effective January 1, 2013, and as last amended by a Third Amendment effective as of the dates indicated therein; and

WHEREAS, by Section 11.01 of the Plan, the Employer reserved the right to amend the Plan with the approval of the Merit Board and the county fiscal body; and

WHEREAS, the Employer desires to amend the Plan in certain respects heretofore considered and discussed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Plan is hereby amended, effective January 1, 2025, as follows:

1. The definition of "Salary" in Section 2.01(l) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(l) 'Salary' means, in the case of each Participant the total compensation amount (as shown on U.S. Treasury Form W-2 for federal income tax purposes) actually paid to him by the Employer for the calendar year in question. However, in the year of employment, severance, or reemployment, 'Salary' shall equal the sum of the following items: 1) for each completed month of employment, basic wages, salary differential, overtime, pay for vacation time taken, and holiday pay for such month multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is twelve (12) and the denominator of which is the number of completed months of employment in such year, plus 2) any additional pay for vacation not taken, sick pay, and other compensation amounts included on Form W-2 for such year that were not included in the pay that is annualized under the preceding item 1. 'Salary' (and 'Final Average Monthly Salary' as hereinafter defined) shall be subject to any further modifications or limitations described in the following provisions of this subsection. In any year beginning on or after January 1, 2021, including year of employment, severance and reemployment, Salary cannot exceed the sum of a Participant's annualized basic wages plus any longevity by more than \$5,000. Items included in the \$5,000 maximum are overtime, pay for annual leave not taken, any additional pay for vacation not taken, sick pay and any other compensation amounts that are not part of annualized basic wages plus any longevity. Holiday pay is not included as part of the calculation of the \$5,000 maximum. In any year beginning on or after January 1, 2025, including year of employment, severance and reemployment, Salary cannot exceed the sum of a Participant's annualized basic wages plus any longevity by more than \$10,000. Items included in the \$10,000 maximum are overtime, pay for annual leave not taken, any additional pay for vacation not taken, sick pay and any other compensation amounts that are not part of annualized basic wages plus any longevity. Holiday pay is not included as part of the calculation of the \$10,000 maximum."

2. Section 5.01 of the Plan is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

"Section 5.01. Normal Retirement. The Normal Retirement requirement for a Participant originally hired prior to January 1, 2021, and who severs employment prior to January 1, 2025, is attainment of age fifty-five (55). If a Participant is originally hired on or after January 1, 2021, and severs employment prior to January 1, 2025, Normal Retirement requirements are attainment of age fifty-five (55) and at least eight (8) years of Credited Service.

"The Normal Retirement requirements for a Participant originally hired prior to January 1, 2025, and who severs employment on or after January 1, 2025, is the earlier of (a) attainment of age fifty-five (55) or (b) attainment of age fifty-two (52) and at least eight (8) years of Credited Service.

"If a Participant is hired on or after January 1, 2025, Normal Retirement requirements are the attainment of age fifty-two (52) and at least ten (10) years of Credited Service.

"Pursuant to Indiana Code 36-8-10-12(b), Normal Retirement may not be later than age seventy (70). The Normal Retirement Date of a Participant is (a) the date he satisfies the requirements for Normal Retirement if he satisfies the requirements on the first day of a month or (b) the first day of the first month following his satisfaction of Normal Retirement requirements if he satisfies the requirements on a day other than the first day of the month. 'Normal Retirement Age' means, with respect to a Participant, the Participant's age as of his Normal Retirement Date."

3. Article V of the Plan is hereby amended by the addition of a new Section 5.05, which shall read as follows:

"Section 5.05. Special Early Retirement. A Participant with at least twenty (20) years of Credited Service may retire as of a Special Early Retirement Date any time after his forty-ninth (49th) birthday. To qualify for a Special Early Retirement, a Participant must meet both criteria as of his severance date. A Participant's Special Early Retirement Date shall be (a) the date of his actual retirement if he retires as of the first day of a month or (b) the first day of the first month following his actual retirement, if he retires as of a day other than the first day of a month. Credited Service for purposes of satisfying the eligibility requirements of this section does not include Credited Service purchased under Section 3.04 of the Plan."

4. A new Section 6.09 is added to the Plan and shall read as follows:

"Section 6.09. Special Early Retirement Benefit. A Participant who severs employment as of a Special Early Retirement Date on or after January 1, 2025, shall be eligible for benefit payments pursuant to this Section. The Special Early Retirement Benefit shall be a monthly benefit based upon the Participant's Credited Service and Final Average Monthly Salary as of his Special Early Retirement Date computed in accordance with the formula set forth in Section 6.01 **with no reduction for commencement prior to the Participant's Normal Retirement Date.**

"The Special Early Retirement Benefit may commence on the Participant's Special Early Retirement Date or the first day of any month following his Special Early Retirement Date and

shall be payable monthly to him during his lifetime, with a final payment on the first day of the month in which he dies."

5. Section 7.01 of the Plan is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

"Section 7.01. Severance Benefits.

"(a) Upon attainment of Normal Retirement Age, a Participant shall be one hundred percent (100%) vested even if he has not severed employment. In the event of severance of a Participant's employment with the Employer because of retirement, he shall be one hundred percent (100%) vested in the benefit earned as of his date of severance. In the event of severance of a Participant's employment for reasons of death or disability, any benefit payable from this Plan shall be governed by Sections 7.02 and 8.02, respectively. In the event of severance of a Participant's employment with the Employer for reasons other than death, retirement or disability, and after completion of the minimum number of years of Credited Service required for vesting, he shall be entitled to receive either (1) or (2) below, at his option:

(1) A lump sum payment which shall consist of the Net Amount of Contributions as of the date of severance plus the amount transferred by the Participant (adjusted for interest at a rate that ensures the Plan remains actuarially cost neutral) pursuant to Section 3.04 for the purchase of Credited Service.

(2) A monthly benefit equal to the amount of benefit earned by the Participant as of his date of severance multiplied by the percentage set forth in the following tables:

For Employees whose initial employment commencement date is prior to January 1, 2025:

<u>Credited Service At Severance</u>	<u>Vested Percentage Of Earned Benefit</u>
Less than 8	0%
8 or more	100%

For Employees whose initial employment commencement date is on or after January 1, 2025:

<u>Credited Service At Severance</u>	<u>Vested Percentage Of Earned Benefit</u>
Less than 10	0%
10 or more	100%

A former Participant who elects the benefit under subsection (a)(2) must notify the Committee of his then current address when such individual attains his commencement date so that benefit payments may commence thereafter. Failure to so notify the Committee by the Participant's seventieth (70th) birthday shall cause the benefit described herein to be forfeited.

"(b) A Participant whose employment with the Employer severs for reasons other than death, retirement or disability and who, as of his date of severance, has not completed the minimum number of years of Credited Service required for vesting, shall be entitled to the payment as set forth in subsection (a)(1) above.

"(c) If a Participant elects payment of the Net Amount of Contributions, as provided in subsection (a)(1), such payment shall be made as soon as practicable after the Participant's severance from employment. If a Participant elects payment of the benefit provided in subsection (a)(2), then benefits shall commence on the Participant's Normal Retirement Date, unless the Participant elects otherwise pursuant to this subsection (c). A Participant who elects a monthly benefit as provided in subsection (a)(2) and who is credited with at least twenty (20) years of Credited Service may elect to receive a monthly benefit commencing on the first day of any month commencing after he reaches Early Retirement Age equal to the amount of benefit earned by him as of his date of severance from employment reduced five-twelfths percent (5/12%) for each completed month by which the commencement date of such benefit precedes what would have been his Normal Retirement Date. Payments of such benefit shall continue thereafter until the first day of the month in which such former Participant dies. In lieu of a life annuity, a former Participant may elect to receive the Actuarial Equivalent of such benefit in accordance with any of the options provided in Section 6.04 at any time after he is eligible to commence such benefit and before such benefit actually commences.

"(d) In the event that the employment of a Participant, otherwise eligible for the benefit described in subsection (a)(2) above, is severed due to said Participant's dishonesty or misconduct which relates to his employment with the Employer, the Committee, at any time prior to the applicability of Section 11.02, shall have the power to cause the Participant to forfeit the benefit for which he would otherwise be eligible. The Committee shall apply this power in a nondiscriminatory and uniform manner to all Participants in similar circumstances."


